


SECOND EDITION THUS. Robert Shelton's translation, the first into English, with engravings after Coypel. ESTC identifies editions of Shelton's translation with Coypel's illustrations published in 1725, 1731, and 1740.



THIRD EDITION THUS. Robert Shelton's translation, the first into English, with engravings after Coypel. (see previous item)

SEVENTH EDITION THUS. A handsome set of the seventh edition of the Motteux translation, revised and edited by Ozell. Rius notes that the plates are "unas malas copias de Coypel."

FIRST EDITION OF THIS DUTCH EDITION of Don Quixote, published simultaneously in a French language edition, with Coypel's celebrated illustrations. The original horizontal configuration of the scenes was necessarily cropped to fit the vertical quarto format and the original large scale of the engravings, printed 1723-4, was much reduced here. Still, this edition "assured wide circulation" (Ray) of Coypel's illustrations. "It is not too much to say that the pictorial tradition associated with Cervantes' masterpiece owes as much to Coypel as to any other artist" (ibid).



FIRST HOGG ONE-VOLUME EDITION. A rather crude one-volume edition of Smollett's translation, previously published by Hogg in four volumes and in his New Novelist's Magazine. The plates, which Rius signals out as this edition's one virtue, are dated 1794.



FIRST SPANISH SMALL-TYPE EDITION. A beautiful copy in contemporary Spanish binding of this royal printing of Don Quixote. Rius notes this is the first Spanish edition printed in small type and has high praise for the edition in general: "La impresión, muy buena; el papel, excelente, y el gusto tipográfico que en esta edición se nota, la colocan en el lugar de las bellas." With a biography of Cervantes by Manuel Quintana and 48 engraved plates after Antonio Rodriguez.







FIRST EDITION THUS. Translated into French and annotated by Louis Viardot. Ray commends this edition ("a wonder of Romantic bookmaking") for Johannot's illustrations highlighting the "sad profundity" of Don Quixote, whereas previous illustrators had made the knight a figure of ridicule. The volume I frontispiece portrait of Don Quixote exists in two states, with mustache (as in this copy) and without.







FIRST EDITION of Fielding's ballad opera, begun in 1728 while he was studying literature in Leiden and dedicated to the Earl of Chesterfield. A second edition was published in 1754; this first edition is uncommon on the market.
